The Symposium's classes are held at the Columbus College of Art and Design. Located in downtown Columbus, CCAD is adjacent to the Columbus Museum of Art and Columbus State College. There is twenty-four-hour security and on-site campus parking. The state-of-the art studio classrooms are just steps away from the dorm and caféteria. All buildings are handicap-accessible.



Each day of this workshop is devoted to a different composition challenge. Day one explores squares and rectangles, day two experiments with curvilinear shapes, day three works with collage-and-cut process, and day four deals with landscape. Using step-by-step directions with lots of creative options, each student makes four small quilts (about 16" x 20") using Sue's fusible techniques. Sue also covers fusible basics, working with non-traditional fabrics, and briefly quilting, blocking, and binding. By the end of this workshop experience, construction ideas will abound!

Creating the Illusion of Depth in Art Quilts

Discover a variety of ways to create the illusion of depth in a two-dimensional plane (in our case, a guilt.) Along with fabric, students will work in a collage style, using mixed media such as paints, papers and found objects to create a series of small studies. In the end, you will leave with a better sense of command over how to create a feeling of three dimensions, depth and foreground/background within your two-dimensional art.

Learn to compose improvisationally by building from pieces you've created. A great class for composition work and designing without a plan, pattern, or idea, this class studies how to read design elements, what's strong, and what to toss. Using a variety of piecing techniques, and tips on construction, we will make mini-works that morph to a finished art quilt, learning to develop in a larger scale. We'll work our improv to a finished set!

Dyes & Paints—A Combined Approach Sewing Machine All

In this class, we will explore dyeing techniques combined with fabric paint processes to produce original fabric designs. Emphasis will be placed on creating cohesive compositions while building layers of pattern and color. We will start with simple dye activities and then add patterning using our paintbox of techniques as the week progresses. Activities will include creating your own stamps, working with silkscreens, batiking with soy wax and more. (Note: this class can be combined with my 2-day playing with fabric paints class for a full week of surface design study.)

Their beauty inspired Picasso, Matisse and Klee to collect them, so let their unpredictable geometric designs start your magic!

Susan's aim is to inspire participants to create fiber art heirlooms using vintage and recycled materials and other found objects, transforming them into stitched expressions of personal legacy. Most supplies will be provided. Students will develop an action plan for working with their own family treasures by experimenting with stitching on old photos, tagging keys with significant words, adding text to textiles and turning old spools into stitched mementos. This workshop delves into both memories from the past and hopes for future remembrance.
