Classes in design and composition, art quilting, embroidery, surface design and mixed media challenge students to push the boundaries between what is considered craft and what is considered fine art.

There is more to QSDS than just classes! Evening activities include faculty presentations, a weekly mini-bazaar and, on Friday nights, an end-of-the-week celebratory reception and auction to benefit the QSDS Scholarship Fund. There is 24 hour security, on-site campus parking and a grocery store right across the street. The state-of-the-art studio classrooms are just steps away from the new dorm and caféteria. All buildings are handicapaccessible.



SESSION I • 5 DAYS

Expressive Dye Painting and Printing
Level Sewing Machine
Intermediate/Advanced No \$80-100

Bold and expressive use of Procion MX dyes is the goal of this workshop. Sue teaches her layered, painterly approach using direct application, monoprinting, and various other techniques. Emphasis is placed on developing sophisticated color combinations and using interesting tools, along with adding touches of metallic and opaque fabric paints. Sue will share helpful hints, technical information, and her own variations.

Multi Media Design
Level Sewing Machine Supplies Fee No \$50

The various non-woven materials available today can be a wonderful addition to traditional fabrics, extending your range of expression. Paint, fuse and cut out these materials, making samples and coming up with many exciting ideas for your own designs and patterns. Explore the use of electric cutting machines, creating designs and programming them into the machine. This is a chance to experiment with ways to produce images with non-wovens, and methods for incorporating them into art quilting. New techniques of fabric surface design using found materials will also be explored.

Joomchi and Beyond

Joomchi is a traditional Korean art that requires only water and eager hands to rework layers of Hanji, colored mulberry papers, into a new, cloth-like or leather-like textured handmade paper that is strong enough to be sewn, painted, collaged or worked into free-standing forms. This workshop offers participants the opportunity to try several hands-on techniques and to become acquainted with Joomchi's history, practice and role in Korean society. This is the perfect opportunity to intensify your search and do an in-depth investigation of your particular passion, find out what your work can be. Bring work already in progress or in the planning stage. We will study and discuss the work of other artists as well as your responses to your favorite artists in various fields. This class offers you time, space and opportunity to explore and develop your work in the direction of your personal interest in a supportive and creative environment. Designing Digital Fabric Alice Frenz **Sewing Machine** Supplies Fee Level ΑII Nο None

Use Adobe Photoshop CC in CCAD's computer lab to create designs ready for uploading and printing on fabric by services such as Spoonflower. Learn to create and edit compositions and seamless repeats using photos, scanned objects, typography and images created with your ipad or smartphone. Previous experience working in Photoshop is required. To get the most from this class, you will want to have experience with and feel comfortable using at least half of these tools in Photoshop CS5, CS6, or CC: layers and layer masks, selection, eraser, type and brush tools, cut and paste, crop, and transformations such as flip, rotate, scale, and clone stamp.

Susie Shie Lucky Drawing: Freehand Sketchbook 5 Day Level Sewing Machine Class Fee ΑII Nο None

In this class, you won't be tracing, erasing, collaging or copying from art that you see. You'll be drawing freehand in sketchbooks, from life, from photos, from memory or from your imagination. It doesn't matter what your skill level is now, even if you haven't drawn since you were five years old. Learning to draw is like learning to float in water: learn to trust, let go and discover that you could have done it all along. Each day, we'll do 10-minute meditative drawing exercises, then work on one to two sustained drawings of optional themes. There will be no negative criticism, only appreciation and inspiration by working in a nurturing group.

This is an optional continuation of 5-day class, "Expressive Dye Painting and Printing." It is a chance to spend an extra two days using the exciting techniques and skills you learned. You can use this time for personal exploration, collaboration with other artists, and individual consultation with Sue. Prerequisite: Must have taken Sue's 5-Day dye workshop immediately before this session or at some other time.

New Techniques in Painting Betty Busby Supplies Fee Level Sewing Machine Nο \$15

Free-flowing acrylic textile paints such as ProChem's Silk and Fabric Paint or SetaSilk work beautifully on almost any type of fabric. Betty has developed several innovative methods of producing surface designs taking advantage of the properties of these paints. Experiment on the provided silk habotai, as well as your own fabrics,

with wet-into-wet methods. Work with textures placed under and over the fabric and learn to create your own textures from found objects. Shiva paint sticks and Inktense pencils will add another layer of spectacular color and texture. Special techniques for producing cloud and sky formations will also be explored.

Jiyoung Chung Joomchi Weekend Supplies Fee Level Sewing Machine \$18 ΑII

Joomchi is a traditional Korean art that requires only water and eager hands to rework layers of Hanji, colored mulberry papers, into a new, cloth-like or leather-like textured handmade paper that is strong enough to be sewn, painted, collaged or worked into free-standing forms. Explore the use of beads to enhance your self, your environment, your art, your life! You will learn basic jewelry assemblage techniques, such as bead stringing, turning and wrapping loops and Becky's famous Bead Kabobs, as well as techniques for surface embellishment on fabric using beads. You will be able to choose from several projects to work on, including jewelry and bead encrustation on fabric. All tools and materials are included. There will be tons of beads to choose from!

Diane Muse Crochet Extravaganza Level Sewing Machine Supplies Fee None

Spend your weekend doing something completely different...take a fun, colorful break! Crochet is a relaxing, meditative hand work and a great way to experiment with color. The class will begin by making a sampler of different stitches. Next we

will make several motifs and learn various ways to join them together. From here you can choose to make several samples to use as a basis for making blankets OR start working on a lap or baby sized blanket. We will also cover reading written and diagramed patterns, adapting old patterns, unusual accent stitches, working with different weights of yarn, and improvisational design.

Experiment with Esterita's original technique which re-imagines monoprinting. Start with a photo of architecture, a detail of an object or a still life as your inspiration. Use fusible web and acrylic paints, metallics, watercolor pencils and more to transfer imagery to organza. The transfers will not be reversed, so words and numbers can be incorporated into your design. You will create a completely new and unique form of art quilt by combining and overlapping layers of your own painted organza. Later, we will go a few steps further and explore the image in the abstract through a series of exercises breaking down the and reassembling the elements of the composition into an original piece.

T5 Embellish Your Art Quilt

lishments look terrific and stay securely in place, and a wide range of bead embroidery and contemporary hand stitching techniques..

If your quilts need that extra lift to add sophistication and elegance, this is the class for you! Give them new energy and strength by focusing on the shape and line that are so vital to the design of a successful quilt. Then see what you can do with outlines and added detail. You will never be satisfied with boring quilts again.

Creating unique fabrics and papers becomes easy and fun when you use a variety of everyday objects to make the marks. Come join Leslie and learn how tools can be used in several ways to create very personal papers and cloth for use in quilts and mixed media projects. We will monoprint, make stamps, and work with thermofax screens to build layers and create a rich depth to the surface. Students will develop dozens of pieces that can be used to create a hand-stitched project, such as an accordion book or small quilt top.

The Play's The Thing: Improv Sketches

Join Pat in learning the quick steps to composing improvisationally - or improv - by building off the pieces that start the design for an art quilt. With her toolbox of piec-

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ing techniques and tips on construction, we will make mini-works that will become a springboard to a finished art quilt. Throughout, we'll talk about design elements, learn how to recognize strong composition and focus on color. We'll make a small piece as the base for larger work, and examine how that motif begins a series. Let go of templates and see possibilities develop!

20 Depths Of Dyeing Level Sewing Machine No Sewing Machine \$30-\$45

In general, most of us focus on producing medium-valued fabric when dyeing. Have you ever thought about dyeing very light or very dark fabrics? Using my Exhaustive Dyeing techniques (which does not mean exhausting!) and pro-MX dyes, we will conduct color experiments in immersion dyeing. Our experiments will produce yardage in a range of values, no matter what value you choose to start with: Luscious Lights, Marvelous Mediums or Decadent Darks. We will also explore color mixing to produce our own unique colors. Some dyeing experience is helpful, but not required.

SESSION 4 • 2 Days June 10-11 Tuition \$280.00

Experiment with Esterita's original technique, which reimagines monoprinting. Start with a photo as your inspiration: architecture, objects or a still life (people or pets not recommended for this). Use fusible web and acrylic and metallic paints and more to transfer imagery to organza. The transfers will not be reversed, so words and numbers can be incorporated into your design. You will create a completely new and unique form of whole cloth art quilt using this beautifully painted organza. No previous painting experience necessary!

The Circle Game (in Bead Embroidery)

Circles can be found throughout the natural world and in human designs from diverse cultures and across millennia. In this class we explore and create a sampler of circular motifs in bead embroidery. Working with a wide variety of beads we will learn, design, and stitch a diverse range of circular forms that could also be used in future stitching on art quilts, garments, and other fiber art. There is particular emphasis on: approaches to design for bead embroidery, exploring ways to create/ suggest circular motifs, learning new bead embroidery techniques and developing variations on known bead embroidery techniques.

23 Dizzy Circles

Add vitality and energy to your work with eccentric circles. Used symbolically in all cultures, circles are a strong design element and focal point. Now discover what happens when you move from perfect whole circles to the unexpected excitement of eccentric circles. Learn to use them confidently by fusing, appliquing, piecing or stitching them to add movement and direction to your work. Working with a variety of spirals, helixes and other broken circles, you will learn how to add a new graphic quality by stitching or overlapping eccentric circles to make an individual free-wheeling composition. You may choose to work by hand or machine or both.

24 Wax On-Wax Off

Come spend the weekend experimenting on both cloth and paper, learning to build layers using soy wax, an environmentally safe alternative to traditional wax batik. Working with the wax, paint and a variety of unconventional tools (as well as a few traditional ones) you will explore many ways to achieve interesting and colorful layers. Warning: playing with soy wax can become habit-forming!

25 Slash and Burn: Techniques Pat Pauly for Improvisational Design

Compose and design in a direct way! We'll start with fabric strip sets, slash them apart, then combine and recombine, as we sew quickly (burn through the machine!) to jump start our composition. Restructure the design — with wonderful possibilities for composition. Learn spontaneous piecing techniques for building the composition: how to float shapes, how to cut curves, and compose in a direct way. This workshop focuses on composition, how to read elements for line, contrast, repeat, and value. Sewing skills are what you bring to the class, so quilters at all stages are welcome.

Playing With Fabric Paints

Using fabric paints and previously dyed or solid-color fabrics, we will explore several techniques for creating original fabric designs. We will start by forming patterns using found objects. CANCELLATION POLICY

We make good faith commitments to our facility, teachers and vendors. If you must cancel your registration, the following cancellation policy applies:

• Tuition and Dorm Deposits are non-refundable.

- A \$30 processing fee is added for each registration "change" made after the deposit is made unless the class is cancelled by QSDS.
- A \$60 fee is charged for changes made after March 1, 2017.
- There is a \$30 fee for returned checks.
- Your balance for all charges is due by March 1 (booking will continue until the week of the symposium, but classes are on a "first come, first served" basis.
- All registrations received after March 1: the balance must be paid in full.
- No refunds after March 1, 2017.

MEAL PLAN

The CCAD cafeteria is located on the ground floor of the dorm and offers healthy and delicious meals including vegetarian choices. Students can pay for each meal individually or opt for a meal package plan. The door prices for meals will be: Dinner = \$8.00, Lunch = \$6.80, Breakfast = \$4.80, or a 10-block meal card = \$70.00 (\$6.50 per meal regardless of which meal is taken).
