The Symposium's classes are held at the Columbus College of Art and Design. Located in downtown Columbus, CCAD is adjacent to the Columbus Museum of Art and Columbus State University. There is twenty-four-hour security and free on-site campus parking. The state-of-the-art studio classrooms are just steps away from the dorm and caféteria. All buildings are handicap-accessible.



Boro, kantha, the Quilts of Gee's Bend. Each of these evokes images of old, worn fabrics, simply but beautifully stitched for a new purpose out of need and salvaged cloth. Beginning with pieces of old fabrics—vintage linens, pieces of worn jeans, even bits of blankets or tattered garments—we select, curate, layer, and hand stitch them into new looks and new life. In creating our compositions, we will explore non-traditional hand piecing and applique, hand quilting with heavier threads, inclusion of repurposed embellishments such as shirt buttons and beads from old jewelry, as well as design considerations. This workshop is a meditative blend of history, hand work, repurposing, and art making.

In creating an art quilt, our primary component is cloth. What about other less traditional but beautiful elements like handmade art papers? Let's learn to modify and stabilize unexpected materials, building them into an art quilt's surface design. We will lay the foundation for creating a more dimensional surface by experimenting with a progression of mark-making studies, using paints, gel medium, paper, and unconventional materials. The goal is to mindfully incorporate mixed media materials with art quilting, increasing texture and surface possibilities without compromising the stability of the quilt.

Valerie will also provide the opportunity to work with elements that are pre-cut with a laser cutter.

Let's focus on free-motion quilting and composition. Stitching in artwork begins with an expressive line. Loosen up and explore new territory by concentrating on the character of line and personal symbols through simple drawing, composition, and continuous line machine stitching exercises. Embrace the wonky—there are no mistakes! Begin to see that line is active and reactive, then make the most of whatever occurs by joining ideas to line motifs, exploring what develops. We will make a mess, think in thread, and cut up your stitching samples to create unique compositions.
